

SCHOOL TOURS & PROGRAMS AT THE JSMA 2016–17

The Jordan Schnitzer Museum of Art offers a variety of programs that enrich classroom instruction and serve as arts education resources for K–12 students and teachers.

## School Tours

Experience highlights of the museum's collection and special exhibitions with a tour led by a trained Exhibition Interpreter (docent). Tours are targeted to the students' grade level. Small tour groups and Visual Thinking Strategies, an inquiry-based approach, encourages the exchange of ideas. Guided tours also incorporate multisensory exploration of the works of art. Using the Common Core Standards as a foundation, tours are designed to build critical thinking skills while exploring the museum collection.

For students in grades 3–12, writing and drawing activities may be integrated into the tour upon request.

## Select your tour theme

### Artful Animals (K–5)

Explore cross-cultural connections through images of animals in the museum's collection.

### Exploring Asia! (K–12)

Explore life in historical and contemporary China, Japan, and Korea through fine and decorative art.

### Learning to Look (K–12)

Learn strategies and vocabulary to discuss a variety of art forms in this introduction to the elements of art: line, shape, color, texture.

### People and Places in Art (K–12)

Investigate art depicting people and places across time and cultures.

### ArtAccess (K–12)

This accessible inquiry-based tour and studio art activity are designed for students with developmental, emotional, and physical disabilities. This program is free and includes a bus scholarship, thanks to a generous grant from the John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts.

## ✿ Add an optional studio art activity

Led by an art educator, studio activities provide a hands-on opportunity to further explore themes and images from the tour.

## Timing

Tours are available Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday mornings at 9:15, 10:30, and 11:45, and are approximately fifty minutes in length. Studio activities are an additional fifty minutes. K–1st grade tours will be 25–30 minutes in length. Additional tour times may be accommodated by request with advance notice.

## Fees and scholarships

**Tour fee:** \$3 per student

**Studio activity fee:** \$1–\$3 per student, depending on your school's percentage of Title 1 students.

**Payment** by check, MasterCard, or Visa is due prior to your tour date.

Funding is available to subsidize bus transportation and/or provide reduced tour and studio activity fees, thanks to our privately funded Fill Up the Bus program. To apply for scholarship assistance, indicate your school's Title 1 percentage on the tour request form. Contact the Tour Coordinator at 541.346.0910 for more information.

## Preparing for your tour

A planning packet, including an invoice and a complimentary guest pass, will be sent to confirm your reservation. Please schedule your tour at least 4–6 weeks in advance as space fills up early. We cannot accommodate tour requests scheduled less than 3 weeks in advance. We encourage you to preview the exhibitions before visiting with your students.

For most tours, an Exhibition Interpreter is available to visit your classroom in advance to prepare your students for their field trip. The pre-tour visit is twenty minutes and is offered at no additional cost. The lead Exhibition Interpreter for your tour will contact you to make arrangements.
