

Visiting the Jordan Schnitzer Museum of Art:
Information for UO Students (and their Professors)

Admission to the JSMA is FREE for UO faculty, staff, and students. When visiting on your own, please show your ID at the admissions desk.

Museum policies:

- Obtain a visitor's pin at the Admissions Desk and wear it visibly during the visit. Help us recycle by returning pins to the Admissions Desk after the visit.
- Deposit bags larger than 12"x12", coats, and umbrellas in the lockers or behind the Admissions Desk. Lockers require a quarter deposit; your money will be returned when you collect your belongings.
- Food and drink are not allowed in the galleries.
- As a courtesy to other visitors, please silence your cell phones.
- Only pencils may be used in the galleries. We ask that you please do not lean against the walls while writing. Clipboards and golf pencils are available at the Admissions Desk.
- For the protection of the art, please maintain a distance of at least one foot between your body and the art. Please do not point at artwork with objects, such as pencils.
- Still photography, taken without a flash, for private, noncommercial use is permitted unless an artwork is marked with a no photography symbol. Please refer to gallery signage and ask a museum staff member if you are unsure.

UO Student Membership is FREE and the benefits are great. Student members receive email notices of upcoming events and opportunities and enjoy 10% discounts on purchases in the museum store and café. Sign up at the admissions desk.
