Jordan Schnitzer Museum of Art's World of Work Internship

Who? Underrepresented students from the Lane and Linn-Benton Counties: 8th-12th grade public, private, or homeschool students throughout Oregon.

What? World of Work is a 3-month hands-on paid internship program for 8th-12th grade students at the Jordan Schnitzer Museum of Art (JSMA). World of Work interns will receive a stipend of up to \$700 for their participation in the program and receive an LTD bus pass for use during their internship period if requested. Interns will be exposed to a variety of museum departments and work under the mentorship of museum professionals, students, and practicing artists to:

- Learn professional and personal development skills such as resume writing.
- Learn the fundamentals of art creation such as printmaking, painting, drawing, etc.
- Gain a clear idea about the careers available in museums including communications, curatorial, collections, and education work.
- Grasp an understanding of how different departments in the workplace create a functioning museum.

When? World of Work interns will be applying for the Spring 2025 term that begins on Wednesday, April 9th through Wednesday, June 4th. The time commitment is every Wednesday from 4:00-6:00PM in the JSMA over the course of the term. Applications are due by Thursday, February 13, 2025, by 11:59PM.

Why? World of Work provides students with "ready to work" practical skills and essential 21st century skills by actively engaging them in the museum's work. World of Work interns will be mentored by JSMA professional staff, including University of Oregon undergraduate students from underrepresented backgrounds with proficient experience as Art & Technology majors who will provide meaningful exposure to museum and gallery careers. WoW interns will gain skills transferable to effective leadership, visual thinking, creativity, strong written and verbal communication, and artistic expression. Interns will also establish relationships with the University of Oregon students, faculty, and staff and become familiar with the university setting.

How? The student interested in the position must submit the completed World of Work application form, a separate document with answered essay questions, and two letters of reference by February 13, 2025, by 11:59PM. These documents must be submitted all together and sent from the student or guardian. Intern candidates will be contacted for an interview once all materials are submitted.
