<u>Ambera Wellmann: (Wo)man and Beast in the Round of Their Need</u> was at Projet Pangée in Montreal in 2018. Read a <u>review</u> in Whitehot Magazine of Contemporary Art by James D. Campbell and a concurrent <u>interview</u> with the artist in Momus with Sky Goodden.

In 2019, MO.CO. Montpellier installed <u>Ambera Wellmann: UnTurning</u> as her first institutional solo exhibition.

Lulu Mexico City launched <u>Ambera Wellmann: In Medias Res</u> in 2019, featuring figurative works that were compelled by "a search to pictorially structure female desire."

<u>Ambera Wellmann: Logic of Ghosts</u> was installed at Kraupa-Tuskany Zeidler in Berlin in 2020. The exhibition was "a negotiation with the devestation of the present, one in which the cultural logic of heteronormativity and capitalism are naturalized in the psyche." Read reviews of the exhibition in <u>Frieze</u> by Sonja-Maria Borstner and in <u>Momus</u> by Kristian Vistrup Madsen.

Company Gallery launched its representation of Wellmann with the solo exhibition, <u>Ambera Wellmann: Nosegay Tornado</u>, in 2020. The exhibition included paintings that were inspired by William Blake's apocalyptic works. Read a review in <u>e-flux</u> by Jessica Caroline.

In 2021, <u>Pond Society</u> in Shanghai opened a solo exhibition of Wellmann's work as her first exhibition in China

Ambera Wellmann: UnTurning was at <u>The MAC</u> in Belfast as the artist's first exhibition in the UK and Ireland. Read a review in <u>Burlington Contemporary</u> by Padraig Regan.

Canadian painter Ambera Wellmann was born and raised in Nova Scotia, but divides her time between Berlin, Mexico City, and New York. Her work engages the history of Renaissance and Baroque painting while depicting uncanny, imagined futures and disembodied subjects. **Noise of Oblation** is inspired by the "memento mori" themes of historical still life painting (subtle reminders that life is fleeting and death is inevitable) with a depiction of the current environmental crisis. Two large birds are falling under a red horizon, filled with fatal debris – rotting food, kitchen utensils, glass bottles, and other garbage – that threaten bird habitats and point to a future marked by ecosystem collapse.
