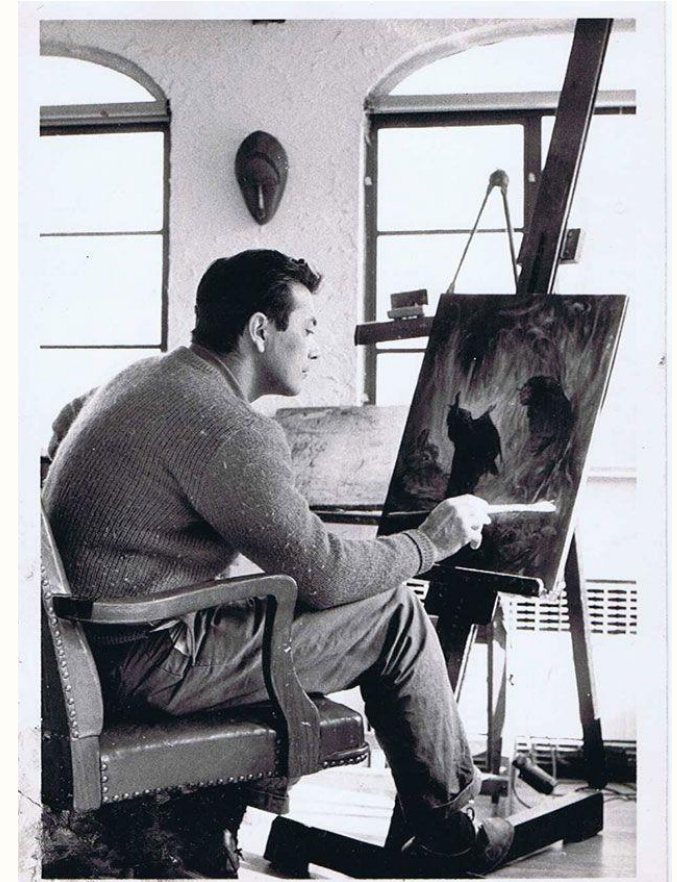

[Marginalia: Inside Comics Art Collections](#) was at the Nouveau Musée National de Monaco in 2021. The exhibition was “an exploration of comic book art, a young art born at the same time as film and psychoanalysis, and which has frequently opted for marginality over convention, humor over academicism and counter-culture over received ideas.” It featured over 350 artworks by some of the greatest comic book artists active throughout the 20th century. In 2021, the [Norman Rockwell Museum](#) organized *Enchanted: History of Fantasy Illustration*, tracing the development of fantasy art from Golden Age illustrators to today. Frank Frazetta is often credited as the “Godfather of fantasy art.” Born and raised in New York, Frazetta began studying at the Brooklyn Academy of Fine Arts when he was just eight years old. In 1944, he started working in a comics studio and built a career creating comic strips, film posters, book illustrations, and album covers with fantasy and science fiction themes. **Conan** is a painting of Conan the Cimmerian, one of Frazetta’s iconic realizations of Robert E. Howard’s heroic character. The image was used as the cover of the 1967 Lancer/Ace Books reprint of the book series, which influenced a generation of pop culture—opening the door to fantasy and science fiction imagery from Star Wars to the Marvel Cinematic Universe.
