Bas participated in the [2004 Whitney Biennale](#), which helped to launch his national and international career.

In 2009, [Hernan Bas: Works from the Rubell Family Collection](#) was on display at the Brooklyn Museum, including 38 works collected by the Miami-based Rubell family for over 10 years. [Hernan Bas: The other side](#) was at Kunstverein Hannover in Germany in 2012. The show was his first institutional solo exhibition in Europe, featuring 40 paintings completed within the previous five years.

The SCAD Museum of Art installed [Hernan Bas: Florida Living](#) in 2017. The exhibition paid homage to the artist's home state of Florida through paintings, screens, and sculptures that "explore allegory, narrative painting and his personal biography."

In 2018, Centro de arte contemporáneo de Málaga installed [Hernan Bas: A Brief Intermission](#), his first exhibition in Spain that ruminated on melancholic images of the classical world.

[Hernan Bas: Choose Your Own Adventure](#) opened at Space K in Seoul before traveling to the Yuz Museum in Shanghai. The exhibition was his first in Mainland China and focused on "adventure," inviting visitors to "roam wildly" throughout the artist's creative chapters.

Hernan Bas spent his childhood in rural upstate Florida before graduating from New World School of the Arts in Miami. His paintings often center adolescent male figures who are deep in contemplation surrounded by complex settings that can be otherworldly or paranormal. **Bone China** features a young man with curly red hair surrounded by a workshop of pottery. He gazes into a white vessel that mimics the skull hanging above. In an interview about the narrative quality of his paintings, Bas said: “there’s always something off about them, and I strive towards that off-ness whenever I’m painting.... Something just always has to be a little wrong. I don’t want to make right painting.”
