Over the course of 2019-20, a complete remounting was carried out by Tomotasu Kawazu of Studio Sogendo with funds provided by the Sumitomo Foundation. This treatment included careful pretreatment analysis, surface cleaning, pigment consolidation, disassembly, removal of old repairs, damaged silk mounting fabrics, and paper backings; relaxation of original support, stabilization with new materials, and remounting using old (where feasible) and new silk mounting fabrics. Additional intervention included limited toning of losses, replacement of roller bars, and the fabrication of a new wooden roller-bar widener (futomaki) and storage box.

Thanks to a generous grant provided by the Sumitomo Foundation, the JSMA was able to have Studio Sogendo conserve and remount one of our most important medieval Japanese paintings over the course of 2019-20. Conservator KAWAZU Tomokatsu's treatment included the stabilization of original pigments, the removal of aged silk and old repairs, the filling and toning of losses, the attachment of new backing papers. mounting fabrics, and roller bars. In addition, a custom *futomaki* (wide roller-bar cover) and a new scroll box were fabricated for the painting, which is currently on view and will be the focus of study for various 2021-22 classes.
