Artist Resources – Joseph Vinache (French, 1653 – after 1717)

Read a <u>book chapter</u> by Jakub Sito, "Sculptors from the Court Circles of Agustus II the Strong and Agustus III, Kins of Poland and Electors of Saxony," which details the Vinache family involvement with the Electors of Saxony in the 17th and 18th centuries.

Joseph Vinache is perhaps overshadowed by his son, <u>Jean-Joseph Vinache</u>, who followed in his father's footsteps and became a well-known sculptor in the 18th century.

French sculptor Joseph Vinache was a well-known bronze founder at the turn of the 18th century. Like many artists at the time, Vinache was fascinated by antiquity and often re-created ancient Greek and Roman marble sculptures in cast bronze. **Gladiateur Borghèse** is a bronze version of the classical Greek marble of the same name by Agasias of Ephesus. The sculpture features an agile swordsman, who defends himself from an enemy attack.
